Turner Donovan Military Books have great pleasure in presenting this special catalogue of the collection assembled by the late David Dalton relating to the Household Cavalry and Guards Brigade of the British Army. The collection contains a large number of scarce works on Guards' campaigns from earlier times to the Second World War and after, as well as the standard regimental histories. It should be noted that David's main concern was the contents of these works, and condition was not the main criteria of his collecting. However, many of the works are in excellent condition and his achievement in building this library - which includes campaigns from early Flanders, through the Napoleonic Wars, Crimea, Sudan, Boer War, WW1 and WW2 – is a remarkable testament to his dedication over many years of collecting.

David Dalton

David Dalton grew up in Yorkshire. He later claimed that his main ambition was to avoid hard work and his Grammar School's gruelling winter cross country runs over the Pennines. However, this was not entirely true: he clearly worked hard and achieved much. David was a keen and active member of the school cadet corps (he conducted a major cadet event on Salisbury Plain with distinction – despite live firing nobody was hurt!). In his last year at school he caught the attention of the Brigade of Guards and was offered the tantalising possibility of a commission in one of their distinguished regiments. There were no guarantees, however, and David took the more sensible course; higher education. His first degree, from Oxford, was in mathematics, then he went on to a doctorate at Birmingham in metallurgy. His career thereafter, in England and (from 1966) in Australia, was in the steel industry. He became head of a major division before he retired. Despite his decision to concentrate on a business – rather than a military – career, David Dalton never forgot his connection with the Brigade of Guards through his early experience with the cadets. He was proud of this and made a great study of the Household Brigade (the Foot Guards and the Household Cavalry). To this end he assembled, over some forty years, an exceptionally fine library containing all the main works on these regiments, including regimental histories, memoirs and so forth.

David died rather suddenly, still collecting and enjoying his library. He had intended to compile a bibliography of his collection and asked me for advice on publishing. It was so large and included such extensive commentary on his subject that I felt that a book was not the right medium. I suggested that a website would be the best forum for his extensive knowledge and I believe he was still considering the options when sadly he became unwell.

Turner Donovan are privileged that David's wife, Judy, and his son and daughter, felt that they should entrust us with the collection. This catalogue is the result of many years of dedicated collecting by David Dalton. I have no doubt that he would be pleased to know that his book collection – in his own absence – would be appreciated afresh by future owners. The Brigade lives on. Its history, as well as its future, is everything to its members and followers. Here in this catalogue its entire history is presented in what is probably the finest collection of its kind ever assembled.

Classic work on later stages of the war in the Peninsula, in which Batty participated as an ensign with 3rd Bn. Grenadier Guards: Siege of St. Sebastian, Bidassoa, Nive, Orthes, Bayonne &c. Ciudad Rodrigo, Salamanca, Vitoria, &c. He afterwards served with the regt. at Waterloo. Rare personal account from the ranks of the 1st Bn. Coldstream Guards of the campaign in Flanders 1793-95. This campaign to expel French invaders is overshadowed by the events of the Napoleonic wars, but at that time, as the author recorded: "Bergen-op-Zoom is thought to be as strong a fortification as any in Europe; besides the great strength of its works, & the vast command it has of the water, being the principal quay of the river Scheldt, it is remarkable for its strong & extensive bomb-proofs, which are said to be capable of containing 100,000 men..." Certainly this campaign was not the last the British Army saw of that citadel. Excellent account of the campaign & its conditions. Here it is paired with another eyewitness account of the campaign, Namur still under siege three years later. Bound together in later 19th Century half calf, gilt to sp., red cloth covd. boards, the original tp of d'Auvergne's work soiled & neatly repaired with the gummed edge from a sheet of postage stamps, o/w VG with armorial bookplate of Gen. The earliest known edition (a later, 1810 edition, added his experiences in Egypt in 1801). Fraser enlisted Scots Guards about 1795 when his grocery business failed ("owing chiefly to my own neglect & want of attention, & having become acquainted with some companions who loved the bottle..."). His army career was chequered but he became an NCO by the time he went to Ireland in 1798 & campaigns in Holland 1799 (& Egypt 1800-01 which is not described in this edition). When a midshipman on HMS *Boyne* he fell from the rigging & suffered injuries which necessitated his leaving the Navy, but obtained a commission in the Coldstream & served until going on half pay in 1835: his Guards career is related in one page, almost all the narrative describing service at sea. Hart's Army List records that Arthur Ponsonby "served in the Crimea as ADC to Sir George Brown during the expedition to Kertch, attack of 18th June, & as ADC to Sir William Codrington on the 8th Sept. & fall of Sebastopol." As far as we can ascertain the letters are unpublished. Ponsonby's letters are written between March 1855 (off Stromboli & at Constantinople) & March 1856: arrived Balaclava 5th April, & recorded: "Here I am at last, our guns & the Russians booming away... Sir George Brown is looking as well as can be... It was one of the most extraordinary sights when I arrived near the Camps, covered for nine miles with the Tents. I walked out to look at Sebastopol, a sort of birds-eye view & most extraordinary it was to see our trenches literally within fifty yards of the Russian advanced posts, both sides hiding themselves under their Parapets, & getting a shot now & then. People here are indignant with *The Times*, they acknowledge it has done a little good but not equal to the lies & abuse it has lavished on people here. *The Times* correspondent (Russell) told P... that many of those letters which are published as being from him, & which abuses [sic] individuals are not written by him, but manufactured in London." Ponsonby describes the several expeditions to Kertch to disrupt the Russian supply chain; an armistice for the purpose of burying dead during which, he reported, Col. Yea chatted with a Russian officer who opined that the siege would not last much longer & - seeing Yea's binoculars, said "You had better keep those glasses to use when you go to the opera at St. Petersburg." Ponsonby was with Sir George Brown & Raglan during the attack on 18th June when the British were repulsed & Col. Yea killed: "Licked! Beaten back & the place not taken, our loss very heavy..." Two days after, he described another truce to pick up casualties: "Such a horrible sight & the stench was awful, all the bodies had been out in the sun for 30 hours. One wretched man, that had been badly wounded & unable to move was making a signal with his handkerchief but til the truce we could not fetch him... Poor young FitzClarence who came out four days ago & only 17, had his leg taken off, he is now in Camp, but fear he will sink under it... Boileau also badly wounded, the Ball went through his prayer book & a picture of his Mother... horrid to see a great many very young soldiers, just come out, horribly mangled... No words can tell how well all behaved, & yet these are the officers that are abused by the press... The flies are tormenting, especially in the hospitals but amongst the men (drunkards as the *Times* call them in the last paper) there is such a beautiful feeling..." With the departure of Sir George Brown sick, Ponsonby became ADC to Gen. Codrington, & there remained a connection between these two Grenadier families for further generations, as this typescript (which from its appearance & the look of the binder in which it is housed was probably prepared in the 1930s) is inscribed in ink "Given to me by Major General Sir John Ponsinby, nephew of the writer, 1941, [Lt.-Gen. Sir] A.E. Codrington." £250.00
